When I received the last Journal I got such a shock  
It's wasn't what went to the printers, certainly not.

I believe Kenneth has used the same printers to produce the journal, with great success since he took over the printing of the Journal in 1998, I don't know what went wrong with the Winter 2023 issue. I always send the journal saved on a UBS stick and also a printed copy, but this time what came through the letter box on the 3 January bore no resemblance to what I sent Kenneth. For starters they managed to alter the numbering of the pages from No. 65-80 to No. 1-18. They also managed to insert a ¾ inch gap into the text on the second page. This caused the last illustration of a British Guiana label on page 69, which got moved onto the next page. From then on every-thing was out of place. Page 6 was half empty, and by the time the computer got to page 17 the accumulation of expanding meant you were treated to a completely blank page.

I have discussed this with Kenneth and while our system has worked fine for nearly thirty years, it would appear his computer has developed a glitch, and can no longer be relied on to send a journal by Email to the printers without distorting it. So in future Kenneth will deliver by hand the memory stick to the printers

I suppose that was the beginning of things going wrong. 2024 started out as a disastrous year, I was woken up on the first of January by my carer with the news that the boiler had sprung a leak and water was pouring down the wall to the kitchen from upstairs. Graham my son in law came and turned the water off, and then waited all day for a plumber to arrive on a bank holiday. He arrived about six and found the leak and fixed a new length of copper pipe replacing the part that had fractured. The only good thing about that day was that the repair was covered by my insurance policy.

Things then brightened up and before January was through, I received an article from Don our Secretary on the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the opening of the British Empire Exhibition. I am always happy to print articles from members, and it would be nice to see some other exhibitions covered, although in the centenary year of the Wembley exhibition opening, that may be too much to hope for.

At least three books are being worked on, and will be published. A new Wembley Advertising Labels book is at the printers done by David Ogden and myself based on the original book published by the Study Group in 2003. It's surprising how much new material has come out of the woodwork in twenty years. This will be in full colour, or rather as many coloured labels we have been able to obtain. Here I must give full credit to David who has done the bulk of the work on the new book, his computer skills and collection of labels far out shine my own.

Don's article features his interest in football an interest I do not have myself. I can remember when I was in the junior school, a punishment for some minor infringement meant I had to miss the games afternoon and stay in school writing hundreds of lines, thus I managed to dodge nearly all the games sessions. Do you remember that form of punishment ?

When I was about 10 my Uncle Bob took me to watch the Dulwich Hamlet play. I wasn't impressed and much later in 1966 my wife wanted to watch a match on the box, that is my only two experiences of watching football. Needless to say I have never watched a cricket match.

My sporting activities were in green bowling where apart from playing, I served as an official for nearly thirty years and cycle racing where I have raced in 10, 25, 50, 100 200 miles, and competed in 12 and 24 hour events. I only had to give up bowling when my legs started to give me trouble, which has steadily got worse until now when I cannot walk without a Zimmer.

This editorial contains a lot of personal reminiscences but that's what you get when your editor is house bound.

## 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the BRITISH EMPIRE EXHIBITION 1924-2024.

This year is the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the British Empire Exhibition at Wembley on a site of 240 acres. The Exhibition halls Pavilions and the Stadium were all built with concrete, many stood into the 1970's. The last one to be after the Stadium was the Palace of Industry.

On St George's Day 23 April 1924 the British Empire Exhibition was declared Open by King George V, which was the first Royal Speech to be Broadcast which was heard around the British Empire.

The stadium was filled with invited guests and the public, on the grass area known as the pitch Bands Marched and Dancing by many groups from around the Empire preformed.

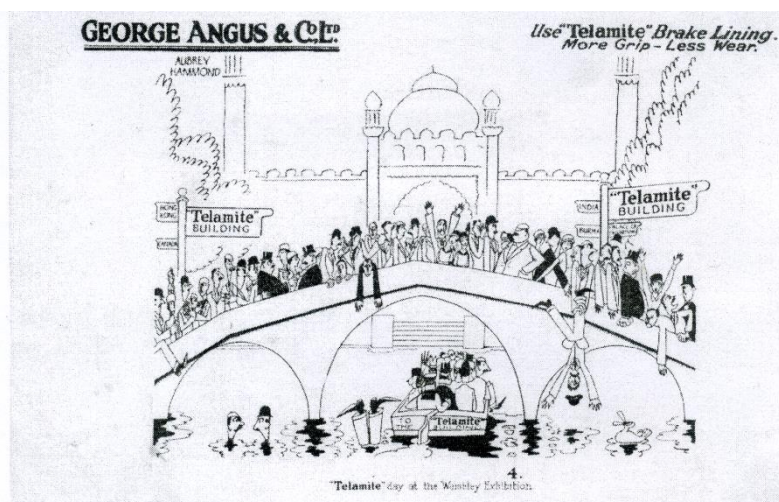
In 1923 the first Football Association Cup final was held with over 120 thousand spectators in the Stadium. This was when Billy the White Horse helped to clear the football pitch.

In 1924 on the Saturday 19 April England played Scotland and on the Saturday 26 after the opening of Exhibition, Newcastle United played Aston Villa in the Football Association Cup Final. This match was to be the first all ticket Cup Final. With the exhibition now being open supporters showed their tickets to get into the Exhibition and Stadium.

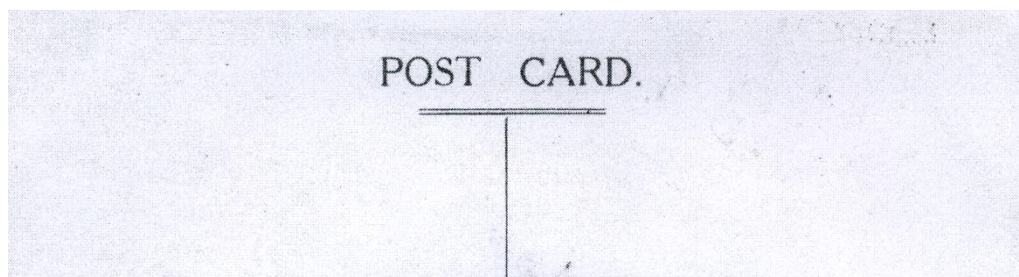
1924 was to be the year of the First Commemorative Postage Stamp, with two stamps issued by the Royal Mail. A one penny and one and half penny being sold only at the two Exhibition Post Offices. Today these two stamps on a First Day Cover can cost over £400 to collect.

On the 16 April the Royal Mail are to issue something to commemorate the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Commemorative Postage Stamps.

With the Wembley Exhibition 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary on the 23 April 2024 I believe that Buckingham Covers are sponsoring a Handstamp for this and are doing 100 covers. I am doing a few covers with the London 2010 Festival of Stamps sheet which had the two 1924 stamps and hope to get them serviced by the Special Handstamp Centre London.

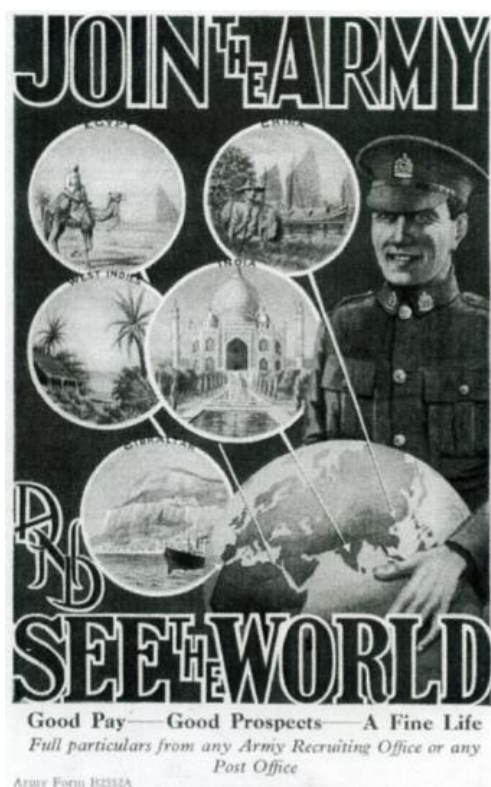
The back of the George Angus card.

- No. 2616. I've just been on the galloping horses at Wembley and I shan't be able to sit down for months and months and months.

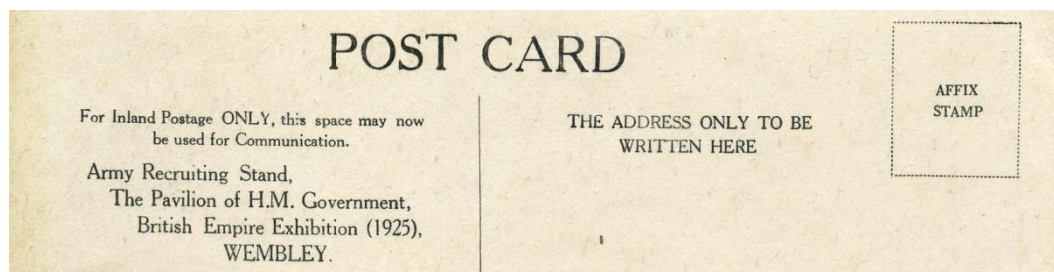
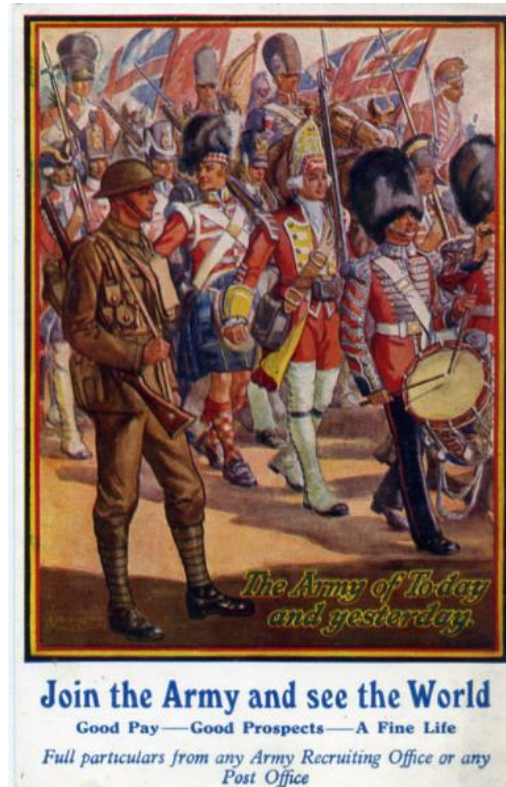

The B/W scan kindly supplied by David Ogden falls into this later group, and I suspect it is also known with an Exhibition back, although one has not been recorded.

Dear Bill,

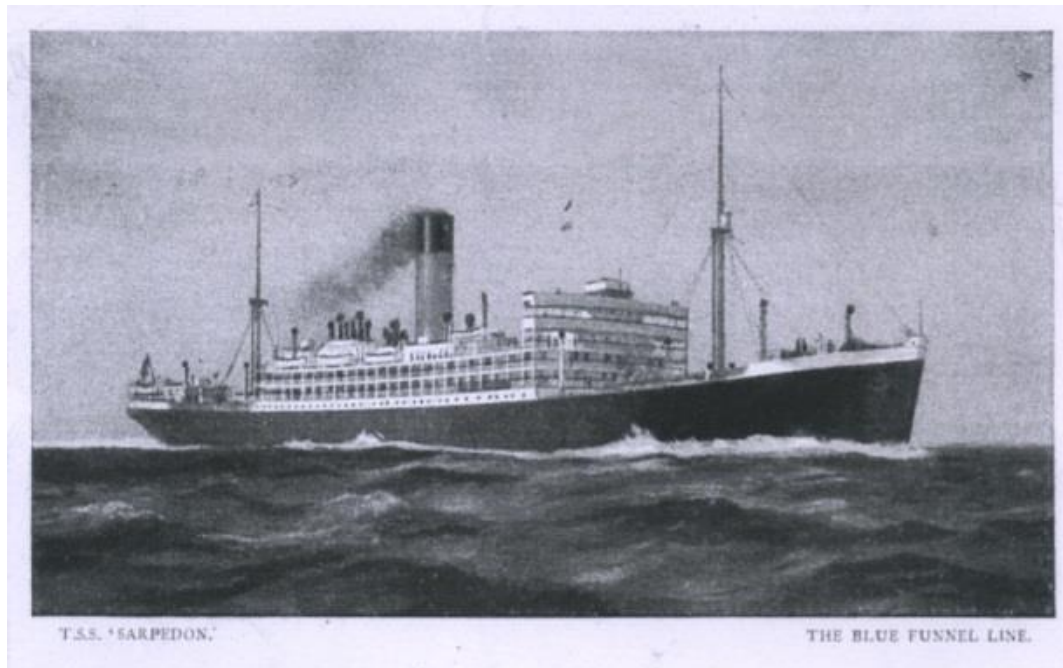
Please find attached a scan of a Blue Funnel Line post card (T.S.S. "Sarpedon") with an Exhibition machine cancellation for the first day (1924). As you know, the Blue Funnel Line were exhibitors in 1924 in the Palace of Engineering (Avenue 3; Bay 35) so the card could have been bought at the Exhibition.

Unfortunately it has a 1d definitive rather than a B. E. E. stamp, and the message refers to it being posted at the Exhibition, rather than bought at the Exhibition.

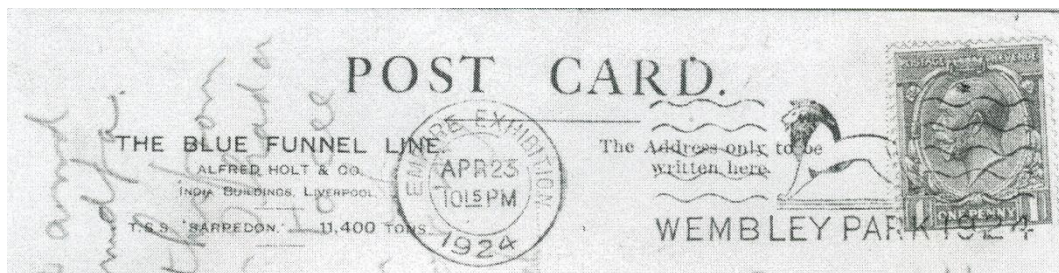
Do you think that this qualifies as a previously unrecorded BEE card?

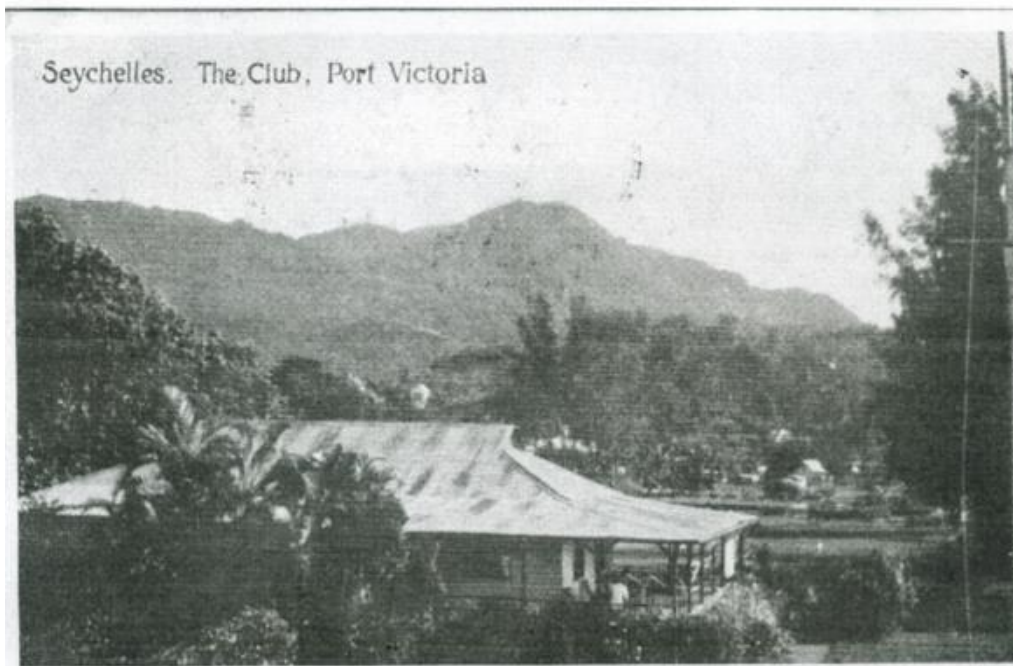


The Blue Funnel Line. T.S.S. "Sarpedon".

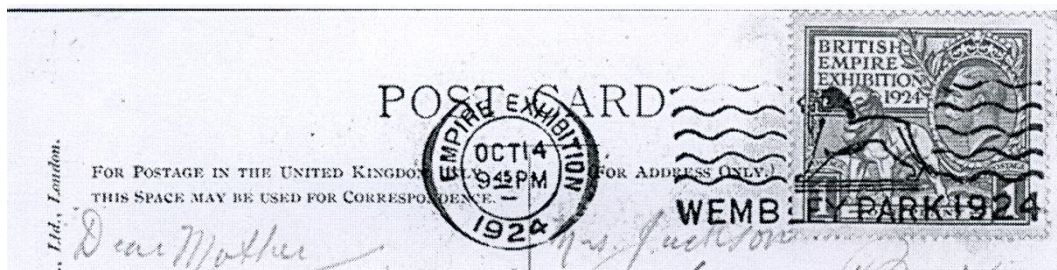


Back of the Blue Funnel Line. T.S.S. "Sarpedon".

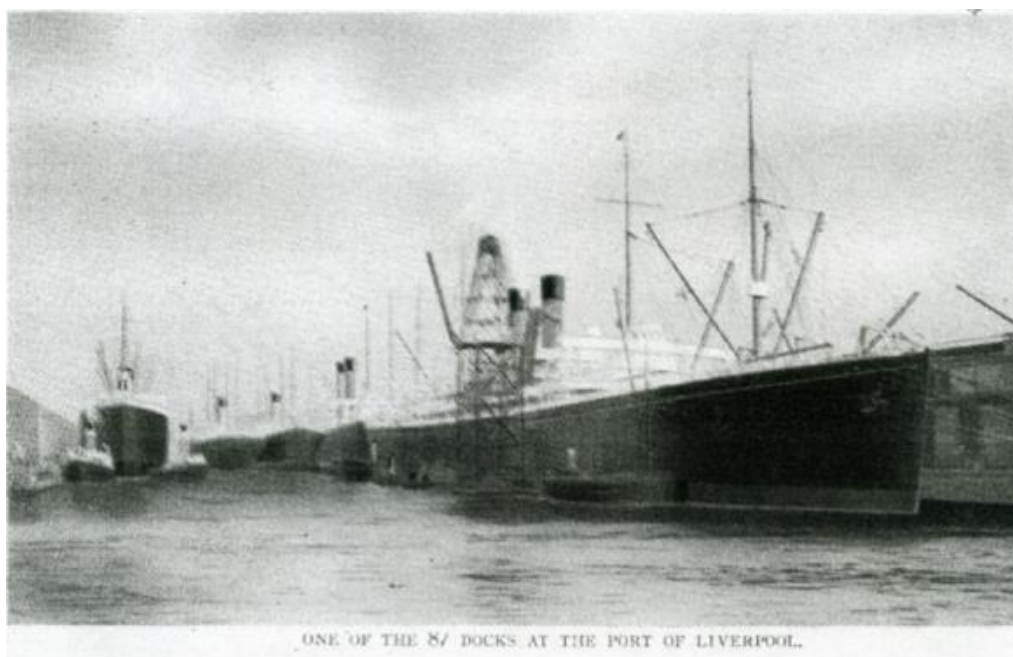

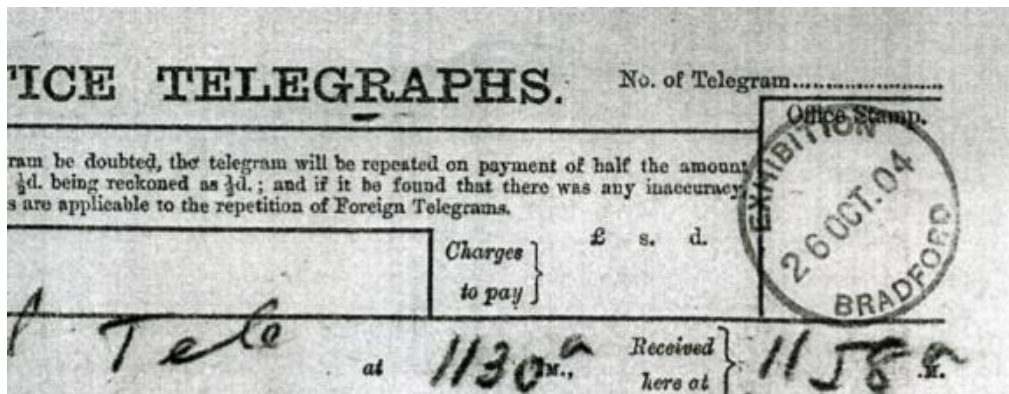
The Bradford post mark must rank amongst the scarcest of all exhibition post marks and only one poorly used example has been recorded used on a post card. The hand stamp was used in the Bradford Sorting Office and here two different hand stamp were used on telegrams.



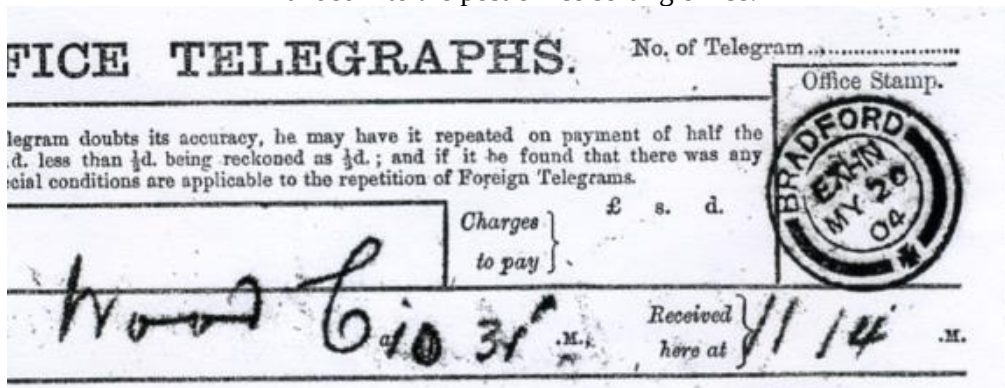

The second hand canceller used in the sorting office.

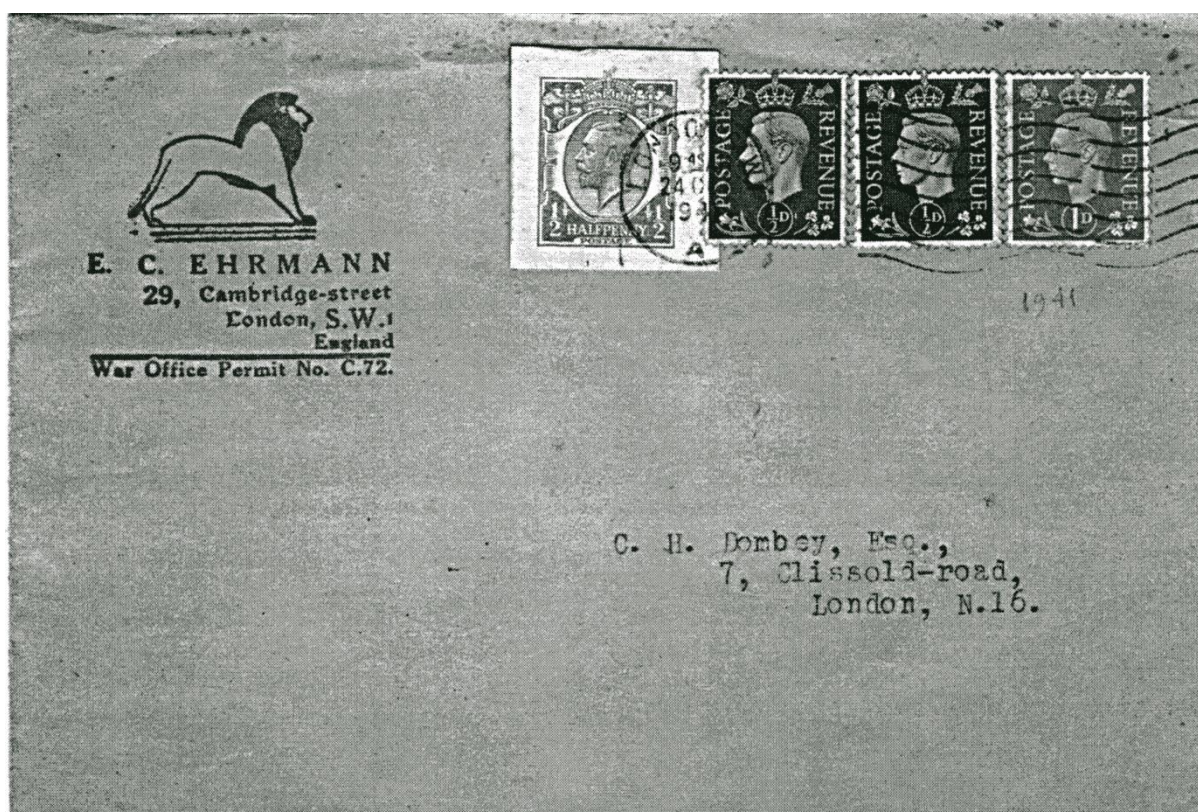

### Wembley stamps with Perfins. by David Ogden

The British Empire Exhibition opened on 23 April 1924. The stamps were initially only available at Post Offices and other approved outlets within the Exhibition, but from 1 July 1924 they could be ordered by post. After that date it would therefore have been possible for organisations to obtain supplies without having to visit the Exhibition. The 1925 Exhibition opened on 9 May 1925 and the stamps could be ordered by post from the outset.

A number of organisations applied their initials to the British Empire Exhibition stamps. Around 40% of these were organisations that were either exhibitors or that were otherwise involved in setting up or running the Exhibition. However, many BEE Perfins are known for organisations that had no apparent connection with the Exhibition.

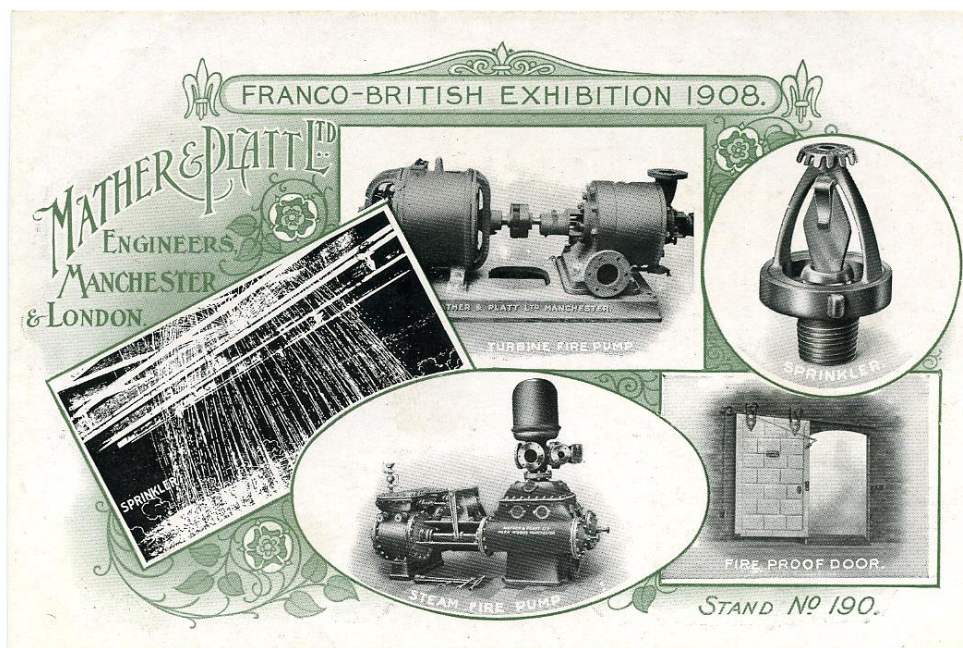

# Exhibition Study Group



## **A brief history of the Journal.**

The cover of the first Exhibition Study group newsletter, produced by Andrew Brooks and sent to just ten members in 1980. Today only two of the founder members are still with us Andrew and Don Knight. Following a notice in the Picture Postcard Monthly the membership increased and that is when I became a member.

By the beginning of 1989 membership had increased to 53, and the Study Group was firmly established. Up until the end of 1991 Andrew had produced 24 Newsletters as the Journal was called then in eleven years.

At this time Andrew phoned me one evening and asked if I would take over as editor of the newsletter to which I agreed, this was early in 1992. From the start I decided to produce four sixteen page Newsletters each year, more than sixteen pages would have exceeded the postal rate. In the beginning Karl Illingworth organised the printing and took on the costs of postage. Later Kenneth was to take on this task in January 1999, and like me is still doing it. I believe it was Don Knight who proposed at one of our conventions that the Newsletter be called 'Journal' in future which was passed, this was in 1996.

I feel it is very important to provide members with an interesting journal, as for many members this is all they get for their subscriptions.
